Hello Ladies and Gentleman of the AAUW Tomah Branch,

It's the kick-off of our 2020-2021season and I think our local organization is more meaningful and needed than ever! Higher education institutions are facing big challenges as they manage the quandary of trying to provide safe, affordable, face to face tutelage. Strides made in women's advancement are tumbling downward with women taking the brunt of household responsibilities and childcare during quarantines and requirements to 'work from home' with small children. Articles on the topic state, 1 in 4 women are leaving or considering down shifting their employment; other reports suggest this pandemic is putting women 10 years behind men in their career paths. Women of color hit the hardest, with highest death rates per 100,000 for Blacks, Indigenous, and Pacific Islanders in that order, plus job loss, and income loss. What comes to mind is the old adage, "Think Globally, Act Locally." Perhaps this may be where our power and efforts could be most impactful.

Minutes of Our First Program Season Meeting:

Tuesday, September 29,2020 6:00 pm via Google Meeting. Those participating were Barb Sullivan, Deb Young, Deb & Dick Thiel, Bonnie Peterson, Nancy VanderMeer, Joline Powell, Sonia Olson, Julia Palmer, Megan Divyak.

President Deb Thiel opened the meeting and Deb Young followed with a review of the agenda and a "check-in type" ice breaker. She then presented Tips for Technology Use.

Deb Thiel spoke about the unusual circumstances we are in and the transition of officers during the summer. She said that Audrey Chambers thanked all members for helping her through her presidency. Audrey was unable to join the meeting due to unexpected circumstances.

Julia Palmer provided a summary of the March Women's History celebration which was the last time our branch met face-to-face. There was discussion regarding doing more recognition of what special things women have to offer in our county, referencing the early years in which our branch observed Women's History Month. Julia Palmer and Sonia Olson, along with anyone else wishing to help, will review ideas to expand/enhance Women's History Month.

Deb Thiel discussed the Jim Theres public program we had planned, noting that several sponsors had come forward. While the event was cancelled due to COVID-19, the experience did show that we could rally community support for this type of event. It was decided that we should keep this idea on the back burner for now.

There was discussion about Tomah's July 4th observance and how our participation brought attention to the 100th anniversary of the passing of the 19th Amendment. It was good exposure for AAUW.

Due to the pandemic, our programs can't be all planned out for the year. For the time being, we will do things virtually and concentrate on communications within our branch. Deb Thiel continues in her role as AAUW-WI District 4 Coordinator, which she feels will provide her with a great deal of information and insight to share with our branch members.

Deb Young and Julia Palmer entertained some suggestions for how we want to handle our popular December holiday event. Deb Thiel and Julia Palmer will join her on working on this.

At our next meeting (Monday, October 19, 2020) we will be looking at how we can communicate and use our on-line resources. Megan Divyak is slated to present discuss the Tomah Chamber of Commerce and our benefits of membership.

The traditional Mary Kay Cosmetics fundraiser will be researched, and the result shared at our next meeting.

It was noted that Dick Thiel has recently co-edited a book that is soon to be available. "As the Twig is Bent" is a Memoir of Wallace Grange founder of Sandhill Wildlife Area. More information will be coming on this. Congratulations, Dick!
